DID YOU KNOW...? OLYMPIC TRIVIA

- Britain is the only nation to have won at least one gold medal at every summer games.
- Former Olympic equestrian events that are no longer held include the horse high jump, horse long jump, vaulting and polo.
- Equestrianism at the Olympics can be traced back to 682 BC, when a four-horse chariot race was run at theHippodrome at Greece's 25th Olympiad.
- More athletes than spectators attended the 1900 Paris Olympics.
- The 1908 Olympics had just two polo teams, England and Ireland, with the English winning gold.
- The sport of eventing made its Olympic debut in **1912** in Stockholm, Sweden.
- From **1912** the equestrian disciplines were those we know today, but there was no dressage team medal until 1928.
- In **1912** the dressage competition included a jumping test of four obstacles up to 1.10m in height.
- The **1924** Olympics were the first at which equestrian competitions were held under the authority of the FEI.

A FOCUS ON TRAINING: FROM THE JUDGE'S POINT OF VIEW

The Happy Horse

Successful trainers often refer to the importance of the horse's happiness. Riders must remember that the horses' emotions are not influenced by an occasional carrot or by the rider's exuberance after a good ride in the ring.

It is important not to treat a horse as a human friend who will understand periods of separation, silence and excuse our frailties. The horse's happiness depends on the daily routine and the environment. Most important is the balance of demand and reward in the training period. We must be patient, repetition must be measured and reward must be frequent with every sign of progress.

Treated with balanced requests during training sessions and relaxed rides around the property or in the country, the horse will be happy. It will show signs of joy that make a "good ride" brilliant.



ODS Bylaws Change Regarding Officers Up For Vote

At the 2018 ODS Summer Meeting, the following proposed Bylaws change will be voted upon. All ODS members are encouraged to attend the meeting and vote upon these changes. The wording to be considered for revision is highlighted in red below.

Article VIII Officers

Current wording:

Section 2: Duties and Authority

B. In the absence of the President, or in the event of the President's inability or refusal to act, the Vice President shall perform the duties and have the authority of the President. The Vice President shall perform such other duties as the President and/or the Board of Director's may assign. The Vice President is the President-elect fo the following year. The Board reserves the right to re-elect the President and Vice-President for a second term if agreed to by the President and Vice-President. (Reviewed 2017)sdfsdf

Proposed Changes:

Section 2: Duties and Authority

B. In the absence of the President, or in the event of the President's inability or refusal to act, the Vice President shall perform the duties and have the authority of the President. The Vice President shall perform such other duties as the President and/or the Board of Director's may assign. No one should be president unless they have served on the board for at least one year.





THE HISTORY OF THE SPANISH RIDING SCHOOL OF VIENNA

The Spanish Riding School of Vienna has stood for equestrian tradition and perfection for 430 years. It is the only institution in the world which preserves to this day the classical art of the Haute Ãcole which began in the Renaissance.

The "Spanish" part of its name stems from the Spanish horses 'the ancestors of the Lipizzaners 'which were much sought-after in the royal court at that time.

The equestrian Haute Ãcole dates back to the classical art of riding practised in Greece, which was rediscovered at the end of the 15th and in the early 16th centuries. With the Renaissance came a whole new lifestyle in the dynasties of Europe, which naturally included a new equestrian style different to that which had been practised in the Middle Ages.

From about 1562, Spanish horses were bred systematically by the Archduke Maximilian, who later became Emperor Maximilian II. This Habsburg ruler founded the first Imperial Stud in 1564 at Kladrub in Bohemia. Archduke Karl II, a brother of Emperor Maximilian, was also very interested in breeding Spanish horses and founded the Imperial Karst Stud near Lipizza in 1580.

Although it is still not known when exactly the first "Spanish Riding School" was built, various documents indicate that this may have been in the year 1572. However, it was more than 100 years later, between 1729 and 1735, that Emperor Karl VI commissioned Josef Emanuel Fischer von Erlach to build the baroque Winter Riding School which is world famous today and which has remained the home of the Spanish Riding School. This magnificent hall has a varied and interesting past, and was not only used for riding and training the white stallions. After the death of Karl VI in 1740, it was a perfect setting for jousting contests, carousels, and masked balls. During the Vienna Congresses particularly (1814-1815), the Spanish Riding School inspired an

international audience of the most influential politicians. In the year of the revolution, 1848, meetings were held in the Riding School between the citizens of Vienna and the Reichstag.

Today, the Lipizzaner stallions of the Spanish Riding School can be seen almost every day during Morning Exercises as well as once a week at a gala performance in the Winter Riding School.
