DID YOU KNOW...? USDF TRIVIA

History of Dressage

Dressage dates back to classical Greek horsemanship. The earliest work on training horses was written by Xenophon, a Greek Military Commander born around 400BC. Dressage continued to be developed by the military and during the Renaissance; European aristocrats displayed their highly trained horses in equestrian pageants.

The Imperial Spanish Riding School of Vienna was established in 1572 and dressage training today is based around many of the principles from this era.

Dressage became an Olympic Sport in the 1912 Olympic Games in Stockholm with only military officers eligible to compete until 1953 when the rules evolved to allow both civilian men and women to compete.

The growing enthusiasm for the sport, supported by increased access to knowledgeable military and foreign trainers, finally brought together 81 pioneers of dressage in 1973 to found the United States Dressage Federation.

A FOCUS FOR TRAINING: DRESSAGE RIDERS MUST BE QUICK THINKERS & PROBLEM SOLVERS

I instruct my students to break down their difficulties and have them quickly tell me what they need to do as a correction.

Many times riders feel overwhelmed with the fact that their figures and movements aren't maintaining quality. I encourage them to think in terms of gradual improvement. Instead of riding for perfection, I have them ride to do better.

As they ride the long side, they tell me what they feel is needed fundamentally to improve. Impulsion, straightness, steadying the tempo, etc. On the short side, they make their corrections. On the next long side, they ride having isolated the main problem. The idea is to quickly use the tools the instructor has given them and do "better" each long side. They must be quick to assess and correct. The fundamentals are the key to achieving the lightness and harmony we all seek to perform the exercises with ease both for us and our horses.

Remember the fundamentals are in the training scale. No matter what sport you engage in or what level you have achieved, the key to success is a strong understanding and ability to perform the "basics."

I encourage all riders to take the responsibility of knowing the fundamentals of our sport and to develop their skills in explaining them to their partners.





Combined, the Top-10 AQHA shows saw an increase from the previous year, totaling 97,065 entries in 2017. Rankings were calculated by dividing the total number of entries for each event by the event's total number of show numbers.

“We want to congratulate the show management teams behind these top shows. These teams work hard to provide exhibitor satisfaction and their dedication translated into their show being a major destination for competitors,” said AQHA Chief Show Officer Pete Kyle.





On May 5 & 6, 2018, The Oklahoma Dressage Society will again host its United States Dressage Federation Annual Horse Show at Expo Square in Tulsa, OK.

This show is recognized as a premier equestrian event and draws exhibitors from around the region including Arkansas, Missouri, Kansas, and Texas. Last year's horse show drew over one hundred horse and rider combinations, thirty sponsors and two hundred spectators who came together to support, compete and socialize. We are working to exceed that number this year.

The Oklahoma Dressage Society is a 501(c)(3) Charitable Organization. ODS promotes and encourages men, women, girls and boys from the age of eight through senior citizens to participate in the equestrian sport of "Dressage" (French for "training"). Some people describe Dressage as "ballet" on horseback and also associate it with the famous Lipizzaner Stallions. This Olympic sport originally incorporated the Greeks' methods of training their warhorses. It has evolved into a complex, demanding, and extremely rewarding sport that teaches the young and old responsibility and sportsmanship. Additionally, Dressage is one of the only sports where men and women compete as equals. Today, dressage encompasses training that is used with various other equine activities including, but not limited to, jumping, driving and pleasure riding. There are many therapeutic benefits when incorporating horses with children (handicapped to autistic) and veterans (injured to PTSD). With the recent addition of Western Dressage, the influence of dressage has seen great growth.



The Oklahoma Dressage Society extends to you an invitation to be part of this equestrian experience. 
