## Severe Weather Season and Horses

Being a meteorologist whose company specializes in short-fused convective warning dissemination and communication and a life-long equestrian, there are things you should know to help keep yourself and your horse as safe as possible when thunderstorms are forecasted or imminent. A little knowledge and planning can go a long way if you ever find yourself in a dangerous weather situation. All convective thunderstorms are dangerous, but some situations are more so than others. Many may not like or even agree with what I'm going to present because it's matter of **deciding between the lesser of undesirable options**. Having lived on the Front Range of Colorado, which is second only to the Tampa Bay area for lightning activity, has provided me with decades of experience.

**The OBVIOUS must be stated.** **Save yourself.** You can't help your animals if you're dead.

**Plan Ahead:** Weather forecasts are driven by probabilities which the general public usually don't understand. What does a 20% chance of rain for a given defined area actually mean? It means that 20% of the defined landmass in the forecast will see rain. The other 80% won't. For the 20% who happen to fall under the clouds, the forecast was 100% correct. The other 80% likely say, those stupid weather meteorologists got it wrong AGAIN.

**Dangerous weather is never a surprise.** Much of the same sources of information the TV meteorologists use are available to you for planning purposes. The **best** source is the 3 Day Convective Outlooks from the NOAA/National Weather Service's **Storm Prediction Center (SPC)** in Norman, OK. This product is paid for with your tax dollars and is the tool to go to when planning decisions for **today, tomorrow, and the day after tomorrow**. <http://www.spc.noaa.gov/products/outlook/>

There are 5 levels of risk for SEVERE THUNDERSTORMS which relate back to the probabilities.

Categorical Outlook Legend:		
TSTM	1: MRGL	2: SLGT
3: ENH	4: MDT	5: HIGH



- TSTM:** There will be non-severe scattered thunderstorms in your area. Being aware of lightning should be your biggest concern.
- MRGL:** There's between a 2-5% of thunderstorms deemed to be SEVERE within the darker green areas.
- SLGT:** There's as much as a 15% chance of a SEVERE thunderstorm occurring for any place

within the yellow area.

**ENH:** There is as much as a 30% chance of certain types of threats (tornado, large hail, high wind) occurring for any place within the light orange areas on the map.

**MDT:** There is as much as a 45% chance of certain types of threats (tornado, large hail, high wind) occurring for any place within the red areas on the map. **NOTE: Take it to the bank that your area will likely see some kind of dangerous weather. Consider rescheduling.**

**HIGH:** There's as much as a 60% chance of certain types of threats (violent, long-track tornadoes, very large hail, high wind) occurring for any place within the red areas on the map. **Note: Fortunately, SPC only declares a HIGH risk 5-6 times per year. DEFINITELY reschedule.**

What does all this mean to you? If you're running a show, going to a show, a long trail ride, or any kind of outdoor activity, take a peek at the 3-Day Convective Outlook the day before and certainly the day of. If there are bullseyes that cover your area, consider adjusting your plans. You can read what time of day NWS are expecting the storms to fire up. If they're predicting late afternoon for storm initiation, consider making a short-notice change to start up the show earlier in the morning so you can get all the rides in and send folks on their way before the storms start happening. This is exactly what happened on the final day of the Master's Golf tournament and it was successful. If somebody can't alter their plans, you'd be far better off simply offering a refund than taking the chance of somebody getting injured or worse. Even though something like this would be an "Act of God", you're only as **non-liable** as the mood a jury is in the day of a trial.

**Be able to receive a watch or warning:** Know the difference between the two:

A **WATCH** means conditions are favorable for severe thunderstorms or tornadoes to develop.

A **WARNING** means a dangerous event IS HAPPENING now.

Think of the difference between a watch and a warning in these terms:



There is another category of WATCH which you should be familiar with. A **PDS WATCH** means a **Particularly Dangerous Situation** is developing and it means exactly what it sounds like. Typically, they are issued when the **SPC** has gone to a Moderate or High risk outlook. A **PDS WATCH** means not if, but **WHEN** storms initiate, they will be violent, and long-lived. This usually precedes an outbreak which is frequently deadly. Pay close attention and make adjustments to your plans if you're in a **PDS WATCH** area.



- **A SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WARNING** is defined as producing 1"+ diameter hail and/or 58+ mph wind.
- **A TORNADO WARNING** is defined as rotation occurring in a thunderstorm detected by Doppler weather radar. What is important to understand is that a whopping 70% of tornado warnings don't produce a tornado. Are the meteorologists really that bad? NO. The reason for a 70% false alarm rate is something extremely obvious which most never think about. *The radars cannot see what's happening on the ground.* There may be strong rotation aloft, but no guarantee the circulation has reached the ground. This is why trained spotters are so critical to the warning process.

What's the best way to receive this information? There are now more ways than ever been to receive weather information on our smart phones-over 30K+ to be precise. This is NOT necessarily the GOOD news because the government has no established standards, rules, guidelines, or even best practices in place for entities disseminating their official information. Some do it extremely well. MANY do it very poorly.

Don't assume your weather app on your phone actually does know exactly where you are at any given time because they don't, even though many claim otherwise. GPS is the single biggest drain on your phone's battery, and most phones now come with a program running in the background which is monitoring which apps are allowed to be using GPS. If you have multiple apps running, the user has no way to tell which ones the "ghost" program has allowed access to location services while trying to preserve your battery life. If it has arbitrarily shut down your weather alerting app, you'll have no way to know this. It's a false sense of security that has the capability of getting you killed.

A review of what's available:

**NOAA Weather Radio**: The legacy system used to be the only way to PROACTIVELY push a warning to you. While it is still a very important part of the warning and communication universe, it is only capable of delivering warnings for entire counties which in the Midwest is problematic, as most counties average 1,000 square miles. It is a "heads-up" that a warning has been issued for your county, but you must seek additional information to determine whether the threat will impact YOU. That takes TIME and in severe convective storms, time is your enemy. The most important thing about NOAA weather radio is it operates off a completely unique, discreet, radio network which is not subject to compete for wireless bandwidth during a disaster, making it incredibly reliable.

**Government Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA)**: This free system sends "push" notifications to smartphones that are WEA-enabled for Presidential emergencies, Amber Alerts, and tornado and flash flood weather warnings. A WEA alert is only a "heads up" that you must seek additional information to determine whether the warning actually means your specific area. The government currently cannot prevent the alerts from being delivered outside the intended warning area. There are other serious issues with the reliability of WEA. Think of the "Inbound missile warning-this is NOT A DRILL" which scared people in Hawaii out of their wits in early 2018. WEA weather alerts are equally capable of delivering a false, very scary warning which has no effect on where you currently are. Personally, I have disabled them on my phone because they're not trustworthy and annoying.

**Free Smartphone Weather Apps**: There are literally TENS OF THOUSANDS of them in the app stores. Some work well, most are useless beyond getting current conditions and a NWS forecast. If

they are free, their true purpose is that of a Trojan Horse delivering click-bait advertising which is the only way the developer makes any money. Many are created by people who also build games and other entertainment-oriented apps in countries like Belarus. The more push notifications they deliver to you, the higher the chance of you clicking on an ad, and the more \$\$ they make-it has nothing to do with your personal safety. They are actually motivated financially to OVER-WARN you.

You have heard the adage: “You get what you pay for”. Nothing could be more true with it comes to the critical alerting capabilities and accuracy of FREE weather apps. If you’re relying on free, you’re taking a gamble that could cost you your life. It’s the reason they are referred to internally within our industry as “crap apps”. Be very wary of free when it comes to something this important, especially in the Midwest or Southeast.

I am not promoting any companies, including mine. I’m enlightening readers to be more weather-aware, and to be cautious regarding your short-fused warning sources. Seek out reliable sources of LOCATION SPECIFIC apps or web-based programs which may cost a small annual subscription (usually around \$10/year) but could save your life. If you want more detailed information as to what to trust, contact me.

What is the best course of action for you and your horse to survive a dangerous convective thunderstorm? Here are some facts, some of which are not pretty, but true.

Lightning is the only atmospheric phenomenon that genuinely terrifies me. I describe it like this: If you were attending an outdoor event KNOWING there’s a sniper with a high powered rifle on a 2,000 foot tower randomly shooting at the ground, would you stick around?

If lightning is within 6 miles or less, get yourself and the horses inside if there’s no tornado threat. Flash-to-bang rule: See the flash, start counting “One thousand 1, one thousand 2 or use your watch or phone. If the thunder happens BEFORE you count down 30 seconds, the lightning is LESS than 6 miles away and you’re at risk of being struck (keep in mind, it’s been documented that lightning can actually strike as much as 30 miles from the parent storm, but it is extremely rare). Or, get a reliable lighting app on your phone but remember to be wary of FREE. Hopefully your barn has lightning rods installed. It’s a very worthwhile investment considering most barns have metal roofs.

If you’re out at a venue where you can’t get inside, put the horse in the trailer, close it up the best you can, and get yourself into the vehicle with the windows up. The myth that the rubber tires prevent the lightning from going to ground is just that. If you’re struck, the metal vehicle will deflect the lightning into the ground. There are no guarantees something bad won’t happen to the horses in the trailer, but if they’re outside, tied up to it, they’re MUCH more vulnerable.

Unfortunately when it comes to an inevitable tornado, there’s a trade-off that has to be made. There’s going to be lightning, BUT if one is confirmed and/or observed and heading your way, horses are much safer turned out in a large field than being confined in a barn. Barns are not built to the same safety codes as houses. If it’s struck, it could result in possible collapsed roof and walls, sharp projectiles flying around, nails, broken glass, etc.

Horses can get themselves out of the path of a tornado if they have enough room. A close friend and veteran storm chaser, Jeff Piotrowski has seen this many times.

<http://www.twisterchasers.com> He observed a herd of horses running away from a lower-end tornado on the ground (sorry, but they're not bright enough to know to run at a right angle). They eventually came to a fence line. They all went flat-prone onto the ground as the tornado went right over them. Afterwards, they all stood up and shook themselves off. None seemed to have suffered any injuries. Trust their instincts over the integrity of the barn's construction. Again, no guarantee but it's the best of no really GOOD choices under the circumstances.

If you're organizing an event, PLEASE check the Storm Prediction Center's 3-Day Convective Outlooks and ***be willing to reschedule*** if you are in one of the higher risk bullseyes. The forecasters at SPC are the best in the world. I can count on one hand the number of times they've forecasted a very dangerous situation and it ends up a bust. It's very rare that they aren't spot-on. Ultimately, if you're the event organizer, in today's litigious world, people now ***expect*** that you're looking out for their safety.

If you're just not sure what decision to make, you can always call your local NWS Office and ask their advice. It's the SERVICE part of the name NWS. And consider signing up for a free spotter class. They're typically held in the early part of the year before storm season begins and are extremely informative and interesting.

Horses and severe weather are never a good combination. Please stay SAFE and survive the storm!

## TDF Awards Evie Tumlin Memorial Fund Grants To Adult Amateurs from Region 9

Pamela will use her \$500 grant to participate in a clinic with Betsy Steiner in May. She shared, “I have been a fan of Betsy for years. As a mother of two daughters who also rode dressage, I spent years auditing while they got to ride with high-caliber trainers. It is now my turn to learn in the saddle!”

Gail, from Austin, Texas, is a member and active volunteer of Austin Dressage Unlimited. She has studied dressage for 25 years and earned her USDF bronze medal in 2018. Gail will use her \$500 grant to take lessons with a former Chief Rider of the Spanish Riding School in September. She said, “Wei and I are smiling! We are so happy to receive the Evie Tumlin Fund grant and have the opportunity to ride with a Chief Rider of the Spanish Riding School. This is my chance to learn from one of the living masters, who learned this centuries-old art from the masters before him.”

Evie Tumlin was an integral part of her Region 9 dressage and eventing community. Throughout her years of serving and helping others, she touched many lives and helped to raise several generations of young men and women who loved horses. This Fund was established in memory of Evie by her friends and colleagues in Region 9. Grants are for educational experiences that will further the applicant’s knowledge of dressage and are in addition to the applicant’s typical training plan. The grant application deadline is March 1<sup>st</sup> of each year.

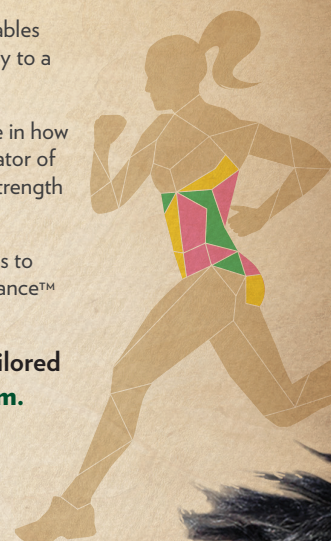
